A reading from the Letter of St Paul to the Romans 8:35,37-39

Nothing can come between us and the love of Christ, even if we are troubled or worried, or being persecuted, or lacking food or clothes, or being threatened or even attacked. These are the trials through which we triumph, by the power of him who loved us.

For I am certain of this: neither death nor life, no angel, no prince, nothing that exists, nothing still to come, not any power, or height or depth, nor any created thing, can come between us and the love of God made visible in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Gospel

Matthew 14:13-21

When Jesus received the news of John the Baptist's death he withdrew by boat to a lonely place where they could be by themselves. But the people heard of this and leaving the towns went after him on foot. So as he stepped ashore he saw a large crowd; and took pity on them and healed their sick. When evening came, the disciples went to him and said, 'this is a lonely place, and the time has slipped by; so send the people away and they can go to the villages to buy themselves some food.' Jesus replied, 'there is no need for them to go: give them something to eat yourselves.' But they answered 'All we have with us is five loaves and two fish.' Bring them here to me' he said. He gave orders that the people were to sit down on the grass; then he took the five loaves and the two fish, raised his eyes to heaven and said the blessing. And breaking the loaves handed them to his disciples who gave them to the crowds. They all ate as much as they wanted, and they collected the scraps remaining; twelve baskets full. Those who ate numbered about five thousand men, to say nothing of women and children.

The Gospel of the Lord.

Reflection

Our readings today evoke the love and compassion the Lord has for his people. The first reading is a generous invitation from God to his people. To us. Inviting us to come to him to be satisfied. In our second reading, Paul responds to God's love he feels and experiences in him. He responds for us as well. Nothing can come between us and the love of Christ. Not even the persecutions, not the ship wrecks, not the difficulty of moving from one place to another proclaiming the good news could discourage the early disciples. The Love of God urged them on. Brethren, let us pray especially in this time, that we may not lose faith, but trust in his love for us. Peace be with you!
