Bishop Ralph invites you to join him on the Jubilee Year 2025 pilgrimage to Lourdes.

Fare £899.00 excludes insurance per person sharing. This includes breakfast, lunch and dinner, plus 10 Euros per person as requested by the Sanctuary.

All are welcome to join the Pilgrimage – pilgrims who need help due to medical issues, mobility, volunteer helpers, doctors, nurses, clergy and general pilgrims.

On Sunday 9th December 2024, Jack Traynor was declared the 71st miracle of Lourdes. **This is the first British miracle of Lourdes.** The cure took place during 1923, during the first Liverpool Archdiocesan Pilgrimage but it was not until a further review of the archives of the Medical Bureau in Lourdes in their Centenary Pilgrimage year that the key evidence from the doctors in 1926 recording Jack Traynor's sustained recovery was traced. The detailed research on the Medical Bureau's archives in 2023 was undertaken by a former Medical Director of the Diocese of Salford pilgrimage, so there is very much a connection within our Province. (Hallam is part of the Province of Liverpool)

Following the classic routes starting from the mediaeval Marian Shrine of Our Lady of Doncaster, pilgrims would cycle down quiet country lanes and cycle trails before finishing in Walsingham – one of England's most ancient and best loved pilgrimage sites.
